

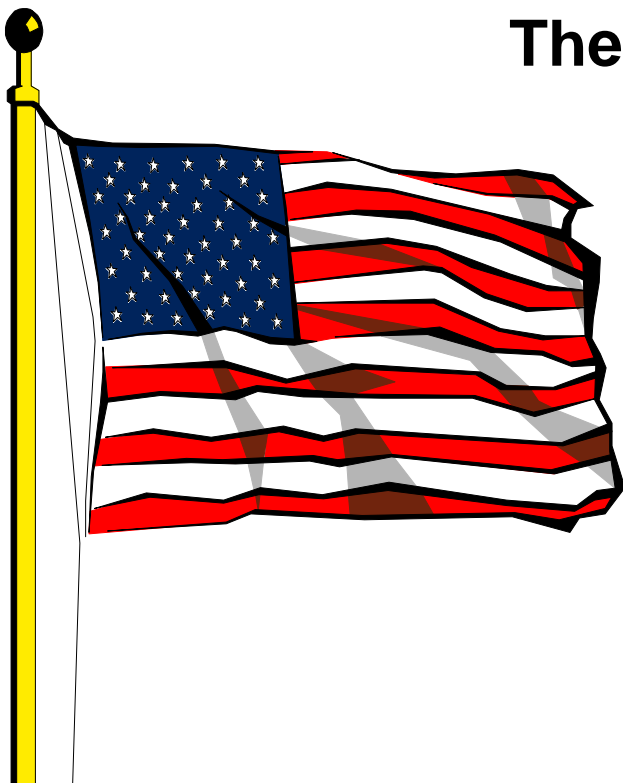

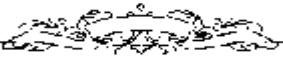

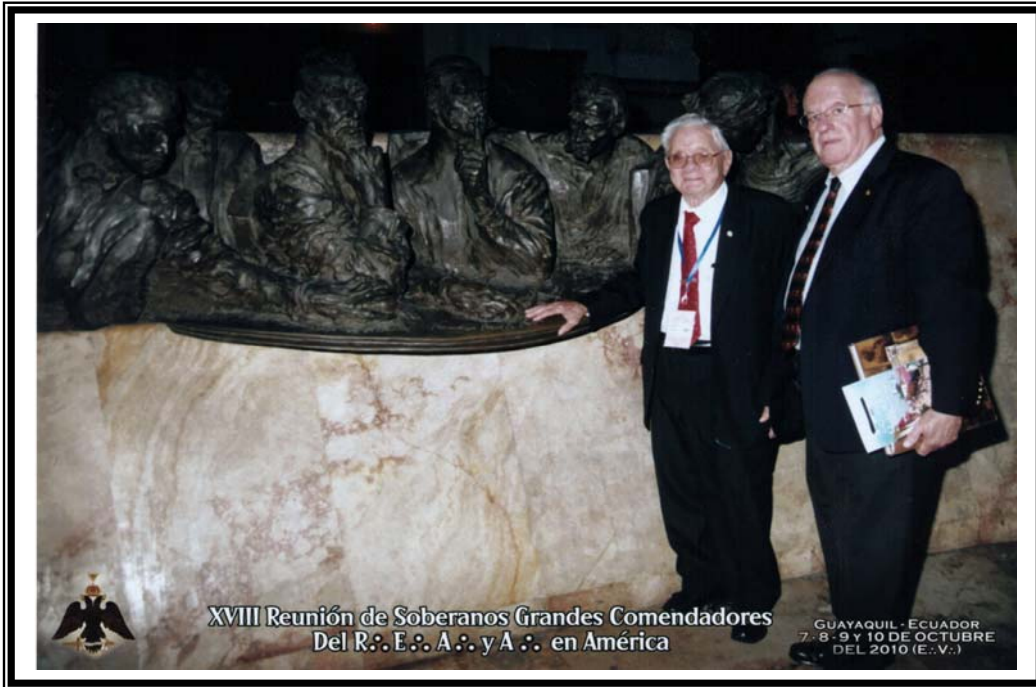

This photo of our Deputy, Ill. Arthur J. Kerr, 33°, G.C., and Ill. Richard Burgess, 33°, Representative of the Northern Jurisdiction, was taken in front of the FRAGUA DE VULCANO monument during the XVIII Sovereign Grand Commanders conference of the Americas held in Guayaquil, Ecuador, October 7/10, 2010.



Built to pay homage to the memory of the men who made possible the independence of Guayaquil, the FRAGUA DE VULCANO monument was inaugurated July 25, 2005, by the person who created it in his mind, the Mayor of Guayaquil, Lawyer Jamie Nebot Saadi.

This sculpture, built by the Spanish Architect Victor Ochoa, has two sections containing the images of those persons responsible for such a significant event.

To the left (and facing East) can be seen, Vivero, Lavayen,

Roca, Ximena and Garaycoa who, together with Villamil and Antepara, form the civilian group of Guayaquil men that on October 1, 1820, organized the plot.

To the right (and also facing East) can be seen two sculptures. The first one representing the three illustrious Venezuelan men from the Numancia Battalion who joined the independence group: León de Febres Cordero, Luís Urdaneta and Miguel de Letamendi; the second one representing the brothers Antonio and Francisco Elizalde, and the Peruvian military man Gregorio Escobedo who distinguished himself in the independence movement.

On the night of October 1, 1820, in a room in the house occupied by Villamil, León, and Garaycoa, this group of men organized the movement that would forever change the future of the country.

The memory of this act is kept with the same name given by José de Antepara, “LA FRAGUA DE VULCANO”.

Olmedo fills the monument with his inspiring presence. He is the Father of an independent Guayaquil, on the night of its liberty.



“MASONS AND MASONRY ON THE PANAMA CANAL 1904-1914”
PART IV
KNIGHTS TEMPLAR MASONRY ON THE CANAL ZONE

Most Eminent Sir William Bromwell Melish, who, as Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America, by virtue of the power vested in him, granted a dispensation authorizing the Canal Zone Commandery to open and hold a Commandery of Knights Templar, and Appendant Council of the Illustrious Order of the Red Cross, and Priory of Knights of Malta, subordinate to the Grand Encampment of the United States, has very courteously supplied the Chairman of the Committee which had charge of the compiling of the Record of Masons and Masonry on the Panama Canal with the following information, which concisely and fittingly describes the methods of procedure followed by the enthusiastic and hard-working Knights Templar on the Isthmus of Panama.

The following is quoted verbatim from the information furnished by Past Grand Master of Knights Templar William B. Mellish:

“On or about March 8, 1912, I received an application for a dispensation to form and open a Commandery in the Canal Zone, Isthmus of Panama, to be known as Canal Zone Commandery (U.D.) of Knights Templar. This application was signed by twenty-four Knights Templar, hailing from twelve different states and twenty different Commanderies. The demits of these fraters accompanied the petition, and a draft for \$100-the usual dispensation fee-accompanied the papers, and this fee I promptly forwarded to the Grand Recorder. The petitioners presented the names of **Sir Francis W. Walraven** for the position of Commander, **Sir Frank Cotton** as Generalissimo, and **Sir Benjamin F. Metcalf** Captain-General, and asked for their appointment as such by the Grand Master should he grant the dispensation. Accompanying the petition was the following letter:

LAS CASCADAS, CANAL ZONE, February 6, 1912

To the Most Eminent Grand Master and Officers of the Grand Encampment
of Knights Templar of the United States of America:

Greeting:

Herewith is a petition signed by twenty-four Knights Templar in good standing in their respective Masonic Bodies, as the certificates which accompany this petition for a dispensation will attest.

We earnestly believe that the existing conditions now prevailing on the Canal Zone will warrant the establishment of a Commandery at this place, as there now are organized both a Royal Arch Chapter and a Council of Royal and Select Masters, each working under dispensation of their respective General Grand Bodies of the United States, each having a large membership, and the organization of a Commandery is looked forward to with interest by many.

After the completion of the Canal, there will be a force retained of 3,500 Americans, and we believe that we will be as fortunately situated to maintain the new Body as the several other Commanderies that are in remote parts of the world and seem to be doing well.

We have for a meeting place the upper floor of a church and lodge building erected by the Isthmian Canal Commission.

The signers of the petition are active members in other Masonic Bodies and will comply with all the requirements of the Grand Encampment should our prayer for a dispensation be granted.

“I made a thorough investigation of all the conditions connected with Freemasonry in the Canal Zone. One of my advisors was **Sir Knight C. H. R. Howe**, Assistant Division Engineer of the B. & O. R. R., now of Chillicothe, Ohio, but for years a resident of the Canal Zone. Sir Howe instituted Isthmian Council, R. & S. M., and served as T. I. M., also serving for two years in the Isthmian Masonic Advisory Board. He is also an honorary member of Canal Zone Chapter, R. A. M., and is one of the petitioners for the new Commandery. Sir Howe furnished me with the following information:

“In reply to your letter of the 11th inst., I beg to state that the ‘Blue Lodge’ on the Isthmus of Panama is not located at Las Cascadas, but at Colon, Republic of Panama. This Lodge, Sojourners' No. 874 (Now Sojourners' Lodge, under the holding of the M.W. Grand Lodge of Massachusetts), was originally chartered in 1898 by the Grand Lodge of Scotland; they lost this charter in a fire, and a new one was granted them in 1904. They have a membership of about two hundred at present, and are erecting a new concrete Temple costing about \$60,000. This Lodge is in direct fraternal communication, by special dispensation of their Grand Lodge, with every Grand jurisdiction in the U.S. The membership of Sojourners' Lodge is composed of Americans and Europeans, there are no negroes in either Lodge or Chapter above mentioned, or in Canal Zone Chapter.

“Would also add that the Master Masons on the Isthmus are not all members of Sojourners' Lodge; there are many who hold membership in the States.

“Canal Zone Chapter, No. 1 (U.D.), is located at Las Cascadas, but I presume that they will move into the new Temple at Colon, when it is complete.

“They began work on July 24, 1910, under dispensation from the General Grand Chapter of the U.S., with seventeen members. They had taken in over one hundred new members on July 24, 1911, and at this date I have no doubt there are over one hundred and fifty. All of their candidates are required to stand examination in the three preliminary Capitular Degrees before they can be exalted.

“As to the future prospects of Masonry on the Isthmus. There are at present between five and six thousand Americans engaged in constructing the Canal, and quoting Colonel Goethals, Chairman of the Canal Commission, I will state that it will require between four and five thousand men to operate the Canal after it is open. The permanent operatives to whom I refer will not be laborers, but high-class artisans, professional men, etc., in the power houses, machine shops, at the naval reservation and dry docks, as well as in the various administrative offices.

I would state that it will not be necessary for the petitioning Sir Knights of the Canal Zone to secure a private hall in which to meet, as the government has erected lodge halls in each of the larger towns on the Zone for the use of the fraternal organizations. There is no charge for the use of these halls. The one at Las Cascadas is admirably suited for Commandery work; it is located on the top of a hill. The first floor is used for religious services on Sundays; it can be adapted readily to work in the Red Cross Degree. The second floor is the regular lodge hall.

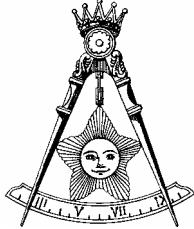
“The distance from Panama to Colon is forty-seven miles. Las Cascadas is situated approximately half way between Panama and Colon.

“The Panama Railroad, owned by the government, runs special trains regularly on Saturday nights for the benefit of fraternal societies and other events. In fact, the government does everything in reason to accommodate and foster social features in order to help preserve contentment in the minds of the employees, who are not overburdened with the forms of amusement available on the Zone.”

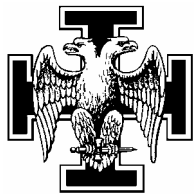

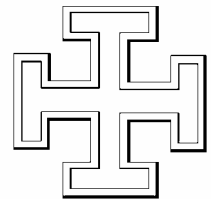
